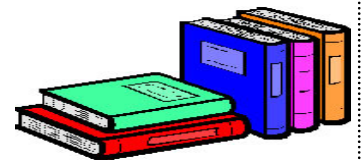
HELPING HANDS NON UNIFORM DAY
