Purpose of Pupil Premium (from the DfE Website)

- The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their wealthier peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most.
- In most cases the Pupil Premium is allocated to schools and is clearly identifiable. It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium, allocated to schools per FSM pupil, is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility.
- Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However, they will be held
 accountable for how they have used the additional funding to support pupils from low-income
 families. New measures will be included in the performance tables that will capture the
 achievement of those deprived pupils covered by Pupil Premium

Pupil Premium - Our Aims at Garfield

- 1. To improve the quality and consistency of good+ teaching and learning across the school so more of our FSM pupils are able to make good progress and attain to national standards or higher.
- 2. Invest in staff CPD to further develop and embed high quality feedback to pupils which will close the gap.
- 3. To widen the educational provision for pupil who are making less than expected progress and /who are not yet at national standards through a range of individual and small group interventions.
- 4. To ensure that all pupils are able to read at an age appropriate level so that they can fully access the curriculum, enjoy reading and gain and transfer, an important core life skill.
- 5. To ensure that pupils who are experiencing social /emotional difficulties are given the appropriate support to help them become happy and confident pupils and more able to learn.
- 6. To provide additional support for pupils and families in need.
- 7. To ensure that pupils whose current behavior or special needs are affecting their learning are given the appropriate support to improve their learning.
- 8. To provide additional study clubs for pupils in year 2, 5 and 6. Last year was for yr 6 only and we wish to widen the provision this year and include a homework club available for all year groups.
- 9. To provide additional teacher support for FSM pupils in year 1 & 2, 3 & 4 and 5 & 6 in order to raise attainment. This would be primarily by non class based Achievement Leaders who have a proven track record in securing good+ progress. We will also have an additional booster teacher specifically for year 6 and an additional KS2 booster teacher.
- 10. To place additional Teaching Assistant Support in the Early Years to develop basic skills/language development in Nursery and Reception.
- 11. To provide enrichment activities for FSM pupils to ensure they aim high and experience opportunities they may not receive due to financial constraints.
- 12. To provide FSM pupils with basic skill resources (reading, writing and maths) to support them both in their learning at school but also at home
