

English

In English this half term we will be reading 'Greenling' By Levi Pinfold, this book will inspire us in our writing. We will be learning to predict what will happen next based on what we have read. We will also be writing a diary entry in first person to explore why the character changes throughout the story. We will also learn about features of a diary, for example it is in date order, how a diary starts, writing in first person, writing in the past tense. We will then publish the diary when completed.

Maths

In maths this half term we will begin by focusing on fractions, including $1/2$'s, $1/4$'s, recognising that $1/2$ equals $2/4$'s, learning $1/3$'s links with the 3 x table. We will then move on to telling the time in 15 minute intervals; quarter to and quarter past, introducing 5 minute intervals later. Also we will cover scales, length, weight and capacity: how to read scales, including where some numbers aren't given, number lines scales marked in 2,5,10s and finding the numbers in-between.

Science

In science this half term we will be learning about what plants need to survive. We will be investigating the basic needs of plants, including light, food, water and air. We will be setting up an investigation on basil plants in different situations seeing which is best. Few will find out and describe how plants stay healthy. We will observe and record our findings to our investigation using a diary. We will also be looking at the difference between a seeded plant and a bulb plant. Finally link where a plant is found to what they need to survive.



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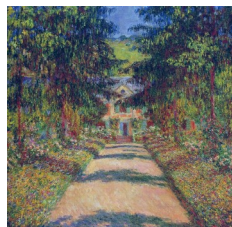


Topic

In our topic lessons this half term we will be doing History—recount the life of a famous British person, sequencing events about the life of that person. Also we will be giving examples of things that are different in their life to the 18th Century.

In Ecology this half term we will investigate how we can help animals' habitats within school grounds, for example bird houses, minibeast homes, attracting bees/insects.

In Art we will be creating different tones, patterns and textures in our drawings. We will also learn how to mix paints creating all the secondary colours, we will also create hues of white to black. The artist we will be researching is Claude Monet. By being inspired with his work and a trip to Kensington Gardens, we will start to gather and annotate our ideas to create a painting in his style.
