English

In English this half term the children will be set weekly writing tasks each week via Google Classroom. Children will be asked to write free verse poetry based on the Caribbean and write a narrative based on Anansi stories.

Children will also be asked to write an informal letter to a class friend of their choice and a formal letter to their new teacher as part of the transition into year 6.

We will also be developing our grammar skills by learning about inverted commas, the use of apostrophes and relative clauses.

Maths

In Math this half term we will continue to learn about fractions, percentages, multiplication and division. Then we will focus on shape, learning how to calculate the area; find a missing length of a perimeter and begin to understand vol-

We would like you to regularly practise your times tables and mental maths, particularly focusing on counting in decimals and knowing the prime, square and cube numbers.

Weekly maths activities will continue to be set every Monday on Google Classroom.

Science

This term, we will be continuing our Science topic, 'Living things and their Habitats'. We will be learning about how animals reproduce and giving children the opportunity to conduct their own research.

The children will be asked to research the life cycle of a bird, mammal and amphibian of their choice. The children will be expected to use scientific vocabulary and facts identify the different stages of the life cycle.

Weekly science activities will be set on Google Classroom for your child to complete.
