

## English

Our literacy for this term will be linked to our topic on the **Ancient Egyptians**.

The first writing task will be to write a report about the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb, using our booklets on Ancient Egypt to find the information needed.

The second writing task will be to write instructions about how to mummify a body.

Children need to read every day and try some of the books on our suggested reading list.

Keep practising your joined up handwriting and complete the weekly spelling tasks.

## Maths

This term we will be continuing our work on place value, addition and subtraction.

We will be revising our times tables and using these to complete doubling and halving problems.

Keep revising how to tell the time to the nearest five minutes and study how your calendar works—months, weeks. We will be solving time problems.

We will also be finding out about the properties of 3 D shapes.

## Science and Ecology

Our science topic is the **Skeleton**.

Can you find out how our skeleton works and find out the names of the different bones, comparing their sizes and uses? Can you compare human skeletons to animal's and find out how **vertebrates** are different to **invertebrates**.

The next part of the topic will be to find out how our **muscles** work through expanding and contracting.

Can you find out how different way animals move using their muscles?

## Topic

Our work on the **Ancient Egyptians** will be linked to our literacy work this term, so we will be reading, writing, researching and becoming historians. It is such a fascinating period in **history**!

To begin, we will be building up a word bank linked to our topic. Try to find out about the archaeologist Harold Carter who discovered the tomb of Tutankhamun.

In **Art and D.T.** can you learn how to write your name in hieroglyphics, making your own cartouches. Can you draw and create a 3D scarab beetle?
