PSHE CURRICULUM FOR YEAR 4

Dear Parent/Carer,

This term, as part of the Relationship, Social, Health Education curriculum, your child will be learning about *Safety and the Changing Body*. This will cover a variety of topics related to Safety and Health Education, such as: online safety, first aid, growing up introduction to puberty (this lessons will be taught in single-gender groups). These areas of learning are vitally important to all children and the school recognises that relationships and sex education is a shared responsibility between schools and parents/carers.

In line with recent changes to RSHE statutory guidance, parents retain the right to withdraw their child from certain elements of Sex Education at primary and secondary school. The right to withdraw refers only to the Sex Education element of RSHE. Parents are not able to withdraw their child from Relationships or Health Education.

Unit Outcomes:

- Safety Education
 - Understand the reasons for legal age restrictions.
 - Understand how quickly information can spread on the internet and some of the risks associated with that.
 - Understand the difference between private and public, and secrets and surprises.
- Health Education
 - Assess and give first aid to a casualty who is having an asthma attack.

- Understand the changes they have already gone through and aware of some changes to come as we develop into adults.
 - Know the names of parts of the body, including those of the private parts for their gender.
 - Understand some of the risks of smoking and some of the benefits of being a non-smoker.
