

Measles

Measles is a highly contagious disease and can lead to complications such as ear infections, pneumonia and inflammation of the brain which require hospitalisation. It is more serious than most other childhood illnesses but is not uncommon in the UK due to the MMR vaccination

People whose immunity is compromised are pregnant women and unvaccinated children are at increased risk of severe disease.

Measles symptoms to be aware of include

- High fever of 37.5 or above
- Sore, watery red eyes
- Coughing/sneezing
- A runny or blocked nose

- Aching and feeling generally unwell
- A blotchy red-brown rash, which usually appears after the initial symptoms.

Make sure your child is up to date with their vaccinations:
