

## Free Chickenshed Theatre Show -Saturday 16th March



## Chocolate Brownies

## **Ingredients**

185g unsalted butter 185g best dark chocolate 85g plain flour 40g cocoa powder 50g white chocolate 50g milk chocolate 3 lärge eggs 275g golden caster sugar



#### Method:

- 1. Cut 185g unsalted butter into small cubes and tip into a medium bowl. Break 1859 dark chocolate into small pieces and drop into the
- 2. Fill a small saucepan about a quarter full with hot water, then sit the bowl on top so it rests on the rim of the pan, not touching the water. Put over a low heat until the butter and chocolate have
- 3. While you wait for the chocolate to cool, position a shelf in the middle of your oven and turn the oven on to 180C/160C fan/gas 4.
- 4. Using a shallow 20cm square tin, cut out a square of kitchen to line the base. Tip 85g plain flour and 40g cocoa powder into a sieve held over a medium bowl. Tap and shake the sieve so they run through together and you get rid of any lumps.
- 5. Chop 50g white chocolate and 50g milk chocolate into chunks on a board.
- 6. Break 3 large eggs into a large bowl and tip in 275g golden caster sugar and whisk them together until thick and creamy.
- 7. Pour the cooled chocolate mixture over the eggy mousse, and then gently fold together without knocking the air out.
- 8. Resift the cocoa and flour and gently fold into the mixture.
- 9. Finally, stir in the white and milk chocolate chunks until they are dotted throughout.
- 11. Pour the mixture into the prepared tin. Gently ease the mixture into the corners of the tin and paddle the spatula from side to side across the top to level it.
- 12. Put in the oven and set your timer for 25 mins. If the brownie wobbles in the middle, it is not quite done, so slide it back in and bake for another 5 minutes until the top has a shiny, papery crust.
- 13. Leave the whole thing in the tin until completely cold, then. Cut into quarters, then cut each quarter into four squares and finally into triangles.
